How is the UMC organized and governed?

The General Conference meets for more than 12 days in April/May every four years unless there is a pandemic or a specially called GC. This is the only official body which can make denominational decisions and speak for the whole UMC.

All the delegates, all the Bishops, the Judicial Council, the General Commissions, volunteers, and observers make quite a crowd. Over 700 delegates come from the UMC all over the world, although getting visas is not always easy or successful, especially for Congolese.

The UMC General Conference is organized in three branches with checks and balances.

On the floor of our "House of Representatives", the number of each conferences elected clergy and lay delegates is based on the size of the annual conference. Lay and ordained equal balance each other. Thus, Illinois Great Rivers Conference elects ten GC delegates, five lay and five clergy, plus some alternates. We also have Jurisdictional delegates which I'll explain another time. GC and JC Delegates are nominated and elected from the pastors and lay delegates who come to Annual Conference from each church. Jeanine Lauridsen has been your delegate for the past 2 years.

The bishops take turn presiding over the plenary sessions with three other bishops to help them. Also of great importance are the general secretary and an expert on the Book of Discipline which contains our rules, heads of general commissions and agencies, and other advisors. Bishops may have much power in their conferences, but at GC they don't get to vote or make speeches. A select few get to preach in the morning worship services and most of them open

the session they chair with a Bible lesson, devotional thought and prayers.

We also elect a judicial council which rules on the legality of legislation and deal with charges against pastors and bishops.

Every day starts with powerful worship services, and there are also inspiring reports of all the general agencies of the church like UMCOR, Africa University, and General Board of Discipleship showing how we have been making disciples of Jesus Christ and transforming the world in the Holy Spirit.

Some decisions take effect on Jan. 1st of the next year. Some come into effect at the end of General Conference. Constitutional changes approved at GC cannot be finalized until it is ratified by 2/3 of the annual conference delegates over the next year.

This is an ever-changing body which makes us an evolving church. There are new delegates every year. You can be nominated if you are an Annual Conference delegate. If you don't like what it decided, any UM member is welcome to submit a petition for consideration in 4 years. UM members may also submit petitions to our annual conference in June up to 30 days prior.

The first week the delegates are divided up to meet in legislative committees to sort through hundreds of petitions, choose which to take to the floor for vote, amend them, etc. There were over a thousand petitions submitted over the past 8 years.

The second week is spent in plenary sessions all together to hear from the legislative groups and vote on their approved legislation and reports. Some goes through on "consent calendar" while other petitions are debated individually.

Central Conferences in other parts of the world gather to make regional decisions. But the US has to hash out all of its concerns at General Conference. A new plan for regionalization will make the US its own region to deal with things like pensions that only affect Americans. Regionalization will also help counter the colonial trend of imposing our US-centric concerns and values on other regions in Africa, Asia, and Europe. We are still united and connectional, one body in Christ.

What is the "General Fund"?



This is the first in a series of articles about how our church finances work. I hope you will find these illuminating and informative, and if you have further questions, feel free to reach out to me using the email at the end.

I'm starting with the General Fund first because this is the info given in the weekly bulletin. In the fall, AD Council approves a budget for the following calendar year. This is the amount of money we feel is needed to pay for basic operations like payroll (we have 6 employees), federal contributions, utilities, money for the trustees to fix and improve the building, missions, youth ministry, music, worship, IGRC apportionments, amongst many others. This does not include our mortgage which is from our Building Fund. Our 2024 budget was about \$250.000.

In the bulletin, I give how much income we've received, from you the congregation, towards our general fund in that month (this is not Building or miscellaneous donations

like Advent and Lenten offerings, flowers, VBS, Raise Right, garage sale, etc.). Then, I give the total monthly expenses from that month (again, the mortgage is not included). The last line where I say we are \$25,821.66 below our budgetary needs means that that is how much we are below (for May), 5/12ths of \$250,000. What I don't say in the bulletin is that we are \$9,100 under budget through May, which means we've lost about \$15,700 in actual money so far this year. This does not mean we are not paying our bills or paying our employees. When General Fund is in the red, we have money in other places to help, but this, unfortunately, is not sustainable in the long run.

Next month I will discuss the Building Fund.
