




#### **Spiritual Growth:**

# Sermon Series for December 2018: "Light in the Darkness"

Debbie Reed, President and CEO of Chaddock, our United Methodist Children's Ministry in Quincy, Illinois, wrote about the children:

"One of the touching and beautiful 'moments' at Chaddock occurs behind the scenes as the day winds down. Like many children, some of our kids are afraid of the dark, and don't like to go to bed. So at bedtime the Chaddock staff often sing to them, or read them bedtime stories, and even sit quietly outside of their door as the children fall asleep. In addition, many of our boys and girls prefer to leave some kind of light on so that the room is not completely dark.

"All of those things bring comfort and peace, even in the midst of the darkness of night—like a ray of light, kindness, and love. That's why there is a connection between the scripture that describes Jesus as the light of the world, and the way that our staff takes special care of the children all through the night. Christmas is a great opportunity for all of us to let our light shine upon these children—to care for them during a dark and difficult time of their life."

Ms. Reed's article reminds me that we show our love for the little child Jesus, born to save us, when we light up the life of a child, not just at Christmas, but throughout the year. Our church is doing just that by supporting all 5 of our United Methodist Children's Agencies in Illinois: The Baby Fold, Chaddock, Cunningham Children's Home, Lessie Bates Davis Neighborhood

House, and Spero Family Services (formerly the United Methodist Children's Home).

During Advent this year our special offering will go to United Methodist Committee on Relief, shining the light of Christ's love for all the many children and adults who have lost their homes and their loved ones, in fires and disasters. Please offer your gifts, and include as many prayers as you include dollars!

I know that it's getting dark earlier and earlier this time of year, but the darkness gives us the chance to enjoy all the beautiful Christmas light displays, especially our own church Christmas Eve services (at 7 and 11 p.m. again this year.) If you have moments when your life feels or seems full of darkness, I pray that God's light of love will break through for you this season. Remember, when you offer light and love to someone else, it can shine a special light in your own life too!
